Prevention: Community-Based Child Abuse Prevention (CBCAP) services support families with children ages 0-5. Services are designed to promote safety and well-being in families facing high-risk factors and living in high-risk environments.

Intervention: Family Support Services (FSS) and Intensive Family Support Services (IFSS) provide in home comprehensive support to strengthen and preserve families who are currently experiencing problems in family functioning and multiple challenges related to safety.

Santa Fe Afghan Resettlement Project

Bilingual, trauma-informed, culturally aware therapists & community navigators provide mental health screenings, family prevention and early intervention services, as well as specialized individual.
