

LETTER FR

Dear Friends,

When I sat down to write this letter, I thought a great deal about the important underlying principles to which Las Cumbres adheres as an agency and as a social service organization. Among the most fundamental are: family, home, health, and safety. This found me considering even the "smallest" detail that a Las Cumbres clinician, preschool teacher, family navigator, or early intervention specialist can provide - from connecting a mother to a resource for diapers or food to understanding what housing security means to so many residing in the rural and predominantly lowincome communities across the four counties that we serve. Client and family needs can present in many forms: a grandmother might seek help being schooled in computer use to help a grandchild in her care with their school assignments - all the while both grandmother and grandchild may be grieving the absence of the child's biological parent. A pregnant mother may need transportation to a doctor's appointment and as her Navigator transports her, a conversation ensues

around the importance of nutritional food. An adult client in services with intellectual or developmental disabilities joyfully boards a Las Cumbres van to join his swimming teammates in the Special Olympics in Farmington. We are honored and humbled by the resilience within each of the individuals and families with whom we work.

As well, in the past two years, with the help of a local foundation grant, more than 300 copies of a Las Cumbres booklet produced in-house, If You Give a Kid a Casa, were distributed to State legislators, collaborative statewide partners and other stakeholders, highlighting the challenges for many Northern New Mexicans to secure housing and how this impacts the physical and emotional well-being of our children. Addressing the opioid pandemic in Northern New Mexico, Narcan trainings were attended by agency staff to educate them on this important prevention tool. Through staff participation and distribution of materials and instructions, the agency assisted clients enroll in the 2020 US Census program.

And then, as fiscal year 2019 came to a close, a new startling situation was looming. As we all quickly became aware, unaccompanied immigrant children crossing into the US were beginning to be separated from their caregivers at the border and placed in border camps. In response, Las Cumbres launched a new program, Santuario del Corazon, to send mobile team members to the TX/NM/MX border, carrying art supplies and behavioral health intervention skills

The work is infinite. We could not do it without the assistance of so many. We thank you for your efforts and contributions.

VANS FOR ADULT SERVICES

Funding was acquired to purchase additional ADA compliant vans for use by the agency's Adult Services Day Habilitation and other programs for clients with intellectual and developmental disabilities. Adult Services provide its adult consumers with opportunities for social interaction, a sense of belonging in the community, and a link to happier, fuller, more enriching lives.

NARCAN TRAINING

Agency hosted a series of Narcan trainings for Las Cumbres teams presented by Bernie Lieving, Overdose Prevention Coordinator with Santa Fe Prevention Alliance. Support forums were slated by Las Cumbres in Taos County with inaugural immigrant program navigation staff.

LAS CUMBRES MOVES TO NEW LOCATION IN SANTA FE


With the award of contract to expand agency Family Infant Toddler Early Intervention Services into Santa Fe County, Santa Fe Las Cumbres offices moved into a larger location on Fifth Street. This enabled us to house all Santa Fe-based Community Infant and Early Childhood and Community Youth and Caregiver programs in a single building.

PARTNERSHIP INITIATES LUMBRE DE VIDA

In partnership with Rio Arriba County Health and Human Services, a program addressing substance use recovery was developed. Lumbre de Vida Program offered help for pregnant and parenting families with young children living in Rio Arriba County to get back on one's feet during and following opioid addiction by providing emotional support and advocacy and referrals into recovery programs.

SANTUARIO DEL CORAZÓN STARTS SERVICES

Las Cumbres Community Services developed its Santuario del Corazón Project to provide specialized clinical and family navigation services for immigrant children who have experienced traumatic separation from a caregiver, due

LAS CUMBRES ADVOCATES FOR CENSUS PARTICIPATION

In partnership with Albuquerque Community Foundation, Santa Fe County and the Federal 2020 Census Enrollment team, Las Cumbres worked to educate staff as well as clients of the advantages of enrollment in the census. Materials and video were developed with focused outreach to agency programs including: Grandparents Raising Grandchildren, Padres Unidos Fatherhood Program, Conjunto Preschool parents and caregivers, Family Navigators and other parent support groups as well as to share with community partners and other providers.




In FY18 the average cost to deliver monthly services per client was \$100




